Community Service Notebook

Your community service notebook is your opportunity to describe in detail, all the hard work you and your fellow Grangers have done over the past year. Although we believe all who participate in community service activities are winners and deserve praise, we unfortunately cannot award everyone a momentary prize. Please take a few moments to review the guidelines before creating your notebook.

Reporting: A Summary Report Form is to be the first page of your notebook. This form can be accepted as your total report; however, we encourage everyone to fill out a notebook describing all their activities in more detail. Reports must be submitted and received by, September 1st, 2023. Reports should be mailed to:

Notebook guidelines and recommendations: Create a story depicting all the community service activities your Grange has participated in this year. Start at the beginning by reviewing how projects were selected. Review the preparation and planning process you utilized for your activities. Include specific details that make the readers understand why you chose to get involved in this activity or with the particular cause. Remember to include acknowledgements and/or any press coverage you received for participating and being involved. Make your book fun, be creative and allow as many members of your Grange to help with the book as possible. A different person could select an activity to illustrate and submit to your book almost like chapters in your story. Identify and recognize all the Grangers and non-Grangers who make your successes possible. And finally, don't forget to add a few photos to illustrate all your hard work!

When your “chapters” are all completed, put them in a notebook and be sure to include the Report Form and have your Grange name and number on the front cover!

Judging of the Notebooks: Please review the following sections before putting your notebook together.

Community Need 30 points

How has the community been impacted by your project? How many people benefited from your project? How did you hear

about this project? Why did you choose this project? Submit proof: Thank you letters, letters of acknowledgement from organizations, etc.

Program Plan 10 points

Explain how the plan was organized and by whom. Explain how project was advertised. (Such as enlisting workers, work Schedule, financing, public meetings, etc.) Submit proof: Flyers, newspaper ads, articles, etc.

Cooperation Achieved 15 points

Describe who was involved (whether it was all Grangers or if you worked in cooperation with other organizations; be sure to discuss in detail the role of the other organizations involved and why you chose to work with this particular group.) Be sure to give an accurate account of everyone involved. Submit proof: photos, letters, etc.

Presentation of Final Report 15 points

Neatness – How well organized is your notebook, is it easy to follow along? Content – did you cover all the areas requested with enough details? Quality of pictures and publicity items submitted. Please be sure to include table of contents at beginning of book and a write up for each project that is listed on the table of contents with photos, newspaper articles, advertisements, etc.

BBCH Activity/MSG Sponsored Comm. Serv. 20 points

Holding a fundraiser internally/externally to benefit BBCH or a MSG Sponsored Comm. Serv. Or volunteering for an event or activity for one of these items. You can include Coups for Troops, House in the Woods, Iris Network, etc.

Activity Summary Report 10 points

Ensuring that your Activity Summary Report form is included in your notebook. The more comprehensive the form is filled out the more points attained. Use below hints as a reference for completing your book.

Overstuffing -10 points

Filling your notebook with excessive photos of the same event not considered community service. Filling your book with excessive photos for any of the events. (For example: cleaning ones' own Grange, repairs to same Grange are not considered Community Service.

HINT: Front Cover of Book – Picture of Grange Hall complete with Grange # and Name Page 1 – Activity Summary Report. Page 2 – Table of Contents. Page 3 – Should be write up and proof of whatever project is listed 1st in the table of Contents. Pages that follow should be repeat of page 3. Hand crafted books are what we are looking for.

The Family, Health & Hearing Committee will be again running the FH & H contest. Work with your Worthy Lecturer to set up a program each month revolving around one of the items we include in the bulletin. Our committee has included a list below of what will be posted for the upcoming year. We changed it up this year.

All items are daily events, but we want you to celebrate them or do them at any point during the month. Please keep in mind, the committee is only making suggestions. Please feel free to celebrate these days as your Grange chooses. Please feel free to take a picture and do the write up and send in with your FH & H report. Let's have some fun in this 2022 - 2023 .

Our committee will award a \$50.00 prize to the top Grange who submits a copy of the program for each month September – August from the list of suggested topics that are posted each month. Nothing fancy, just staple a copy of each program together and mail them into: MSG – Family, Health & Hearing Committee, Christine Corliss, Director 162 Center Road by September 1st, 2023.

- September 2022- September 9th – National Teddy Bear Day –Collect Teddy Bears and donate them to your local pediatric ward at your local hospital.
- September 19th – National Butterscotch Pudding Day – Have a dessert evening of butterscotch pudding and read the history of butterscotch pudding.
- September 30th – National Family Health and Fitness Day – promote family, health, and hearing. Teach the Grange Hall about our Family, Health, and Hearing Program. (DEAF activities)
- October 2022 - October 5th – National Kale Day -Have members bring in different recipes for Kale and share. Maybe, try some at another meeting.
- October 12th – Cookbook Launch Day – Elect a person to collect recipes from members or pull recipes from some past members and put together a “Your Grange” cookbook. Try the recipes over the course of the year.
- October 26th – National Mincemeat Day – Try to serve Mincemeat Pie at a meeting.
- November 2022 – November 5th – Book Lovers Day – share a history of books and people’s favorite authors.
- November 12th – Chicken Soup for the Soul Day -maybe share .
- November 26th – National Mincemeat Day – Share the importance of passing down the health history of a family, sharing so all generations know about it.
- December 2022 - **Holiday Caroling Party – Invite the community into your hall for one night and have a caroling party. Advertise this and have them bring a traditional holiday dish of their family and share a meal and night of caroling.**
- January 2023 – January 13th – National Rubber Duckie Day – Have members collect unique rubber duckies and collect them to donate them to a local day care, hospital, or pediatric doctor.
- January 18th – Winnie the Pooh Day – Read a Unique Winnie the Pooh Story
- January 28th – National Seed Swap Day – Bring seeds in and swap them between them.
- February 2023 - February 3rd – Feed the Birds Day – have people bring in a unique type of bird feeder and hang them outside the Grange to feed the birds. (EX: toilet paper roll covered in peanut butter and rolled in birdseed)

February 10th – National Umbrella Day – share the history of umbrellas and maybe some unique uses for them.

February 25th – National Chocolate Covered Nut Day – Share some.

March 2023 –

March 1st – National Pig Day – Use your imagination

March 8th – National Proofreading Day – Present a typed sheet with a story on it that has typos give the Grange members so much time to find all the errors (Use an egg timer). Give a prize for the winner.

March 29th – National take a walk in the park Day. Create a park at the Grange and take a walk.

April 2023 –

Grange Month – Have an open meeting! Follow National Grange theme – send a picture and advertisement as proof. April 2nd is National Homemade Day use Grange month to promote that item. Have members bring in handmade items and put a table out and sell those handmade items, use the funds to do next month's event.

May 2023 –

Community Service Month – Pick a “NEW” community service that your Grange has not done in the past. Set up and complete this project during May, send in a write up & Pictures with this report.

June 2023 –

June 1st – National Barefoot Day – Have everyone spend a day barefoot at a Grange meeting.

June 10th – National Ballpoint Pen Day – Share the history of the ballpoint pen.

June 30th – National Meteor Watch Day – Show pictures of meteor showers and history of them.

July 2023 -

July 1st – National U.S Postage Stamp Day – Create a game of old and new postage stamps and see if the Grange can match years to postage stamps.

July 8th – National Blueberry Day – use your imagination.

July 30th – National Cheesecake Day – This is all up to you!!!!

August 2023 -
