Because we are separated by so many miles and can't meet together very often we would like everyone to do their Community Services at their homes – Helping some older people in your neighborhood, cleaning up some environment are the two projects to be working on.

### ALL adults working with Juniors and Youth must have background checks.

Beginning in January 2019 it will be offered from the National Grange and National Junior Grange and Youth Departments to obtain a background check through the company "Safe Gatherings" www.safegatherings.com as an alternative for having to obtain and find your own background check company.

It is highly encouraged to have every person in our organization who is working in a supervisory position with our Juniors and Youth under 18 years of age to undergo this background check through Safe Gatherings as it is a National Background Check program that covers many levels of security checks as well as providing a training on working with vulnerable youth and adults.

The benefits of utilizing Safe Gatherings for the Grange is:

A No Hassle system: State Masters, Directors, and Leaders now have the pressure taken off them to make sure these critical steps are taken appropriately in accordance of their state laws. Everything is handled from the National Grange office and your information is kept 100% safe and secure through the Safe Gatherings Network. (No personal information is held with the National Grange) Safe Gatherings provides 4 levels of background checks: Local, State, National, and Sex Offender. Safe Gatherings provides Professional Reference Checks Safe Gatherings provides training for abuse prevention and ideas on how to appropriately work with minors who are at their most vulnerable time in life.

LOW COST- the break down cost for the 2-year clearance through Safe Gatherings is less than \$2.00 a month.

#### JUNIOR CRAFTS for 2023: OPEN TO CHILDREN/GRANDCHILDREN OF SUBORDINATE MEMBERS Age grouping is 5 – 7, 8 – 10, 11 – 14. Your age on January 1, 2023

Judging will be at Grange Family Campout in July or our August 'Grow Juniors Meeting' at Tranquility Grange in Lincolnville. These will be part of next year's Fair Exhibits. The premium money earned from Litchfield Fair will be sent to support the Oliver Hudson Kelley Farm in Minnesota or Grange Foundation for Juniors and Youth. Money earned at other fairs will go to Junior Grange projects, camperships, and the fall 'Grow Juniors' meeting expenses. The Juniors need to do research on the OHK Farm to earn a badge since they've already contributed to support it with their crafts at the fair exhibits. And those are the only two requirements for that badge.

- 2. Age groups for Junior's entries are 5 -7; 8 10; and 11 14. (as of 10/1)
- 3. Entries must have been taken during the contest year (9/1/22 9/1/23).
- 4. The entrant must have taken photos.
- 5. Only prints are accepted for judging.
- 6. Photographer must select the category for his/ her entry.
- 7. All photographs must be Grange appropriate.
- 8. Members may enter as many photos in a single category as they wish.
- 9. With matting/backing, must be no smaller than 4" x 6" and not larger than 11" x 14".
- 10. Frames and glass are NOT permitted.
- 11. Labels must be affixed to the lower right hand corner of the photo.

# <u>Medium</u> Oil & Acrylics Watercolors Charcoal or Pencil, Markers or Crayons (juniors only)

- 2. Age groups for Junior's entries are 5 -7; 8 10; and 11 14. (as of 10/1)
- 3. Entries must have been produced during the contest year (9/1/22 9/1/23).
- 4. Artist must select the category for his/ her entry.
- 5. Members may enter as many pieces of artwork in a single category as they wish.
- 6. Entries must have a frame with suitable hangers or hard matting/backing suitable so they may be displayed.
- $7.~{\rm Glass}~{\rm is}~{\bf NOT}~{\rm permitted},$  however Plexiglas is allowed.
- 8. Labels must be affixed to the lower right hand corner of the artwork.
