ALL adults working with Juniors and Youth must have background checks.

Beginning in January 2019 it will be offered from the National Grange and National Junior Grange and Youth Departments to obtain a background check through the company "Safe Gatherings" www.safegatherings.com as an alternative for having to obtain and find your own background check company.

It is highly encouraged to have every person in our organization that is working in a supervisory position with our Juniors and Youth under 18 years of age to undergo this background check through Safe Gatherings as it is a National Background Check program that covers many levels of security checks as well as providing a training on working with vulnerable youth and adults.

The benefits of utilizing Safe Gatherings for the Grange is:

A No Hassle system: State Masters, Directors, and Leaders now have the pressure taken off them to make sure these critical steps are taken appropriately in accordance of their state laws. Everything is handled from the National Grange office and your information is kept 100% safe and secure through the Safe Gatherings Network. (No personal information is held with the National Grange)

Safe Gatherings provides 4 levels of background checks: Local, State, National, and Sex Offender.

Safe Gatherings provides Professional Reference Checks

Safe Gatherings provides training for abuse prevention and ideas on how to appropriately work with minors who are at their most vulnerable time in life.

- <u>CLASS E: *PLASTIC CANVAS</u> Any item made with any pattern using any product suitable for the entry.
- <u>CLASS F: *COUNTED CROSS STITCH</u> Any item made with any pattern using any product suitable to entry. Pictures may be in frames or stretcher strips, but the back of the work must be visible. DO NOT include the glass with any framed item.
- CLASS H: *LATCH HOOK Any item made with any pattern using any product suitable to entry. Minimum width 18" length 24 45" max. If it is to be a wall hanging, a sleeve is required on the back for hanging.
- <u>JUNIOR CLASS N: MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS</u> Any one (1) item from any of the above categories may be entered in this category. Work by Junior only. Jr -1: Ages 5 -7 Jr -2: Ages 8 10 Jr -3: Ages 11 -13

CLASS O: DECORATED ITEM: Kitchen Towel

2 DIVISIONS Subordinate and Juniors Jr -1: Ages 5 -7 Jr -2: Ages 8 – 10 Jr -3: Ages 11 -13

- 1. Lay the kitchen towel face down completely flat on the table. (Use the pot holder on the towel to adjust the width of the towel to fit the width of the potholder, fold the sides of the towel in and pin in place.) Flip the towel face up.
- 2. Fold or measure the towel and pot holder to find the center lines. (The towel will be face up or the design up and the pot holder will be face down or the design down at this point to attach them together.)
- 3. Lay the pot holder center line face down on the towel center line. Sew straight across all layers on this center line. Don't forget to remove all pins.
- 4. Attach a button on the opposite edge of the pot holder in line with the loop.

CLASS P: WOODEN ITEM: Key Rack

2 DIVISIONS Subordinate and Juniors

Jr -1: Ages 5 -7 Jr -2: Ages 8 – 10 Jr -3: Ages 11 -13

- 1. Must be made of wood.
- 2. Decorate or finish any way you choose. Painted, carved, stick-ons or wood burning.
- 3. Must have pegs or hooks to hold your keys.
- 4. Must have attachment to be able to hang your entry.
- 5. Size no larger than 6" x 12"

- 4. Total the number of books and the number of pages read.

- 1. Open to all Subordinate Grange and Junior Grange members, also children and grandchildren of Subordinate members.
- 2. Age groups for Junior's entries are 5-7; 8-10; and 11-14. (as of 10/1)
- 3. Entries must have been taken during the contest year (10/1/23 10/1/24).
- 4. The entrant must have taken photos.
- 5. Only prints are accepted for judging.
- 6. Photographer must select the category for the entry.
- 7. All photographs must be Grange appropriate.
- 8. Members may enter as many photos in a single category as they wish.
- 9. Entry, including matting/backing, must be no smaller than 4" x 6" and not larger then 11" x 14".
- 10. Frames and glass are **NOT** permitted.
- 11. Labels (included in this booklet) must be affixed to the lower right hand corner of the photo.

#### **Judging Criteria**

Entries in each category will be judged against each other based on the following:

Composition and arrangement

Interest

Presentation

Technique

#### Awards

First, Second and Third places will be awarded in each category. Entrants may be awarded only one ribbon in a single category. No cash prizes will be awarded. One entry deemed "Best in Show" will be chosen by the judges.

After the photos have been judged, members will be given the opportunity to vote for their choice of the best photo. The photo which receives the most votes will be given the **People' Choice Award**.

Deadline: One hour after the opening on the first day of the 2023 State Grange session.

- 2. Age groups for Junior's entries are 5-7; 8-10; and 11-14. (as of 10/1)
- 3. Entries must have been produced during the contest year (10/1/23 10/1/24).
- 4. Artist must select the category for his/ her entry.
- 5. Members may enter as many pieces of artwork in a single category as they wish.
- 6. Entries must have a frame with suitable hangers or hard matting/backing suitable so they may be displayed.
- 7. Glass is **NOT** permitted, however Plexiglas is allowed.
- 8. Labels (included in this booklet) must be affixed to the lower right hand corner of the artwork.
